

Azalea Watchet Robin Hill **(Rhododendron ‘Watchet’)**

Azalea Watchet – Robin Hill (Rhododendron ‘Watchet’) is an evergreen shrub with a dwarf growth habit. This plant should not get much larger than 3 feet high by 2 feet wide. In early spring this plant will produce a mass of soft pink flowers.



Plant Care: Once established in the landscape, azaleas are outstanding plants in Georgia. They love our acidic soil and thrive in shade. Because they are evergreen shrubs, they make good foundation plants. Minimal pruning is recommended since they flower on the prior year’s growth. An application of Camellia/Azalea/Rhododendron fertilizer after the plant stops blooming will promote more flowers and a healthier plant the following year and is therefore recommended, but is not necessary.

Watering: Water this plant regularly until it is established. If the leaves begin curling (but are still green), this plant needs water. Water when the soil around the plant dries out, but before the soil becomes hard.
