

Dwarf Burford Holly
Ilex cornuta 'Burfordi Nana'

Add shiny, medium green color to your landscape with the evergreen leaves of the Dwarf Burford Holly. In fall and winter bright red berries adorn this compact shrub enticing birds and wildlife to your yard. You don't have to worry about male and female plants with this holly. It is self-pollinating and the Dwarf Burford holly can produce berries.



Plant Care: A tough evergreen that is compact and requires virtually no maintenance, this holly is easy to maintain. It has high deer, rabbit, insect, and disease resistance. It is even salt and pollution tolerant. So, it is perfect for urban and coastal areas. This holly thrives in full to part sun and prefers a slightly acidic soil, although it does tend to adapt just about any well-draining soil.

Fertilize in spring with a slow-release fertilizer. This holly does not require pruning, but it does tolerate pruning well if you prefer to keep it a certain size or shape.

Watering: Water your Holly deeply a couple times a week for the first few months. After hollies are established, they only need water during hot, dry spells.
