

Variegated Yucca

(*Yucca gloriosa* 'Variegata')

Yucca, also commonly referred to as Adam's needle, needle palm and Spanish bayonet, describes multiple species and cultivars that grow in the U.S. Department of Agriculture hardiness zones 4 through 10, though individual species and cultivars often have a narrower growing range. Variegated yuccas are prized for the multicolored foliage, upright flower stalks, an overall unique appearance and an ability to thrive in a variety of conditions, including drought.



Plant Care / Watering: Yuccas are extremely low maintenance plants, requiring little to no care once established. Occasional deep watering helps during establishment and encourages leaf longevity in established plants. Spent flower stalks and exhausted crowns can be cut off. Yuccas spread gradually by producing pups around the parent clump. If this spreading is not desired, the young plants should be severed and removed.
